
Dear Faithful Prayer Partners,

It is hard to believe that we have already been back here in Uruguay two months. Thank you to everyone that prayed for us for our safe return to Uruguay. The Lord gave us great flights as well as all of our luggage made it here without any of it getting lost. We left the United States on October 10 and arrived in Montevideo, Uruguay on October 11. We are thankful for Jesse and Glenna Parnell, who picked us up at the airport and let us stay our first night back in the country with them. We had a great time of fellowship and catching up with them.

Early the next morning I arranged for a truck to meet us at our storage unit to pick up our belongings that we had stored before we left for furlough. After we loaded the truck, we headed to our new home in Salto which was a six hour drive from the capital. We arrived at our new house about 4:00 p.m. and unloaded our belongings. Almost everything survived being in storage while we were on furlough, but we lost several things due to mildew.

These last two months we have been getting reacclimated to Uruguay and living in a different city and setting up our house. This included mowing our lawn which grew 5 to even 6 feet in some areas since my brother and I were here in April. It took about six hours of me cutting the weeds and grass with a weed eater, which is what you find a lot of people here use to cut their lawn. The first two weeks here we did not have a refrigerator because the one we had in storage died on us while we were gone. After finding a repair man in town he had it fixed after a few days.

Pray for us as we start a new work here in this town. We live in a city of 100,000 that need to hear the Gospel. Please pray for us as we meet new people and begin to develop a relationship with them and that they will be open to the Gospel. Please pray that we can effectively communicate with those around us. We have had many opportunities to be an example of helping with peoples' physical hardships by giving some food and small change. We witness and give them scripture and plant the seed of the Gospel in their hearts. We don't want to be meeting only their physical needs through charitable giving. Their souls are priceless, and we want to be mindful of both sides. Some friends told us of a book they had read about toxic charity, which can be a real problem. We want to be a help, not a hinderance to their coming to accept the Lord.
